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



So if you have a Model A and need some help on getting it up to snuff, come join our Club and get the mechanical help you need.



Linda and I had lived a spatian life style in some ways through my college years. Not that we were poor as we both worked and because of Linda's budgeting skills lived pretty well. There was little money for fancy food and high living. Our idea of a big night out was a pizza or a hamburger combo from Bob's Big Boy. We were active in two car clubs and had a couple of low end collector cars, a 1931 Chevrolet and a 1927 Star that served our purpose. We also had a \$25 metallic pink 47 Dodge pickup for the shop truck and I was driving a 61 Corvette and Linda her 56 Corvette and even had a used Honda motorcycle. Yes we were living well.

One day while working on a customer's car in my restoration shop (in a two car garage at a rented house) I received a phone call. It was the principal of Tulare Union High School. The principal asked if I could come it that afternoon





Valley Racing History - Crow's Landi

Anyone been to Crow's Landing; an abandoned airfield about 30 miles south of Modesto? Once a Naval Air Station training pilots of F4F Wildcats and TBM Avengers, on September 10, 1967, the SCCA Trans Am Series raced here.



The Trans Am, SCCA's longest running race series, had twelve events in 1967 and was a full on factory supported series for "more or less" stock sedans. Virtually every manufacturer supported a race team, Carroll Shelby with Mustangs, Penske with Camaros and Bud Moore with Cougars. They were full bore FIA Group 2 racecars, often using homolgated parts not available to everyone,. Shelby apparently built 26 cars, more or less built to GT350 specs with dual four barrels and a 32 gallon gas tank. The stock 302 produced 425 hp !! The Cougars used a 37 gallon fuel tank and weighed 300 pounds less than the production version

The event, originally planned for the now defunct Vaca Valley Raceway, succumbed to politics and financial issues and moved to Crow's Landing. Reported as very abrasive and tough on tires, the 250 mile event on a three mile circuit with one mile straights probably would not have occurred without the support of the Gallo family of Modesto who provided sponsorship and the Gallo Trophy.

The race was won by Jerry Titus in a Carroll Shelby entered Mustang at an average speed of 85.2 mph, almost a minute ahead of Peter Revson in a Cougar and Mark Donohue in a Roger Penske Camaro. Titus made only two pit stops and led most of the race. His payoff for winning was \$1250. Other leaders included Milt Minter in a Mustang and Titus' teammate Ronnie Bucknum in another Mustang.

Titus Mustang Takes Crows Landing Trans-Am, Winkler Alfa Wins Small Bore Class

MODESTO, Calif.—Jerry Titus drove north from testing in the Riverside desert to drive a sedan race in California's Central Valley, found the 120 track temperatures to his liking, and won his fourth Trans-Am for Mustang.

Not even Mark Donohue's new superprepared Camaro could approach Titus, who beat Peter Revson's second-place factory Cougar with ease. With Revson second, Donohue was third, Milt Minter (Mustang) fourth, and Ronnie Bucknum in a Mustang fifth. Race average on this new 3-mile airport course was 83.2 mph over the 250-mile distance.

The under 2-liter battle went to Alfa Romeo, as Monty Winkler came home ahead of Porsche's Bert Everett, Everett,

who tangled with Winkler's teammate, Horst Kwech, in the early laps, was able to complete the race on only one tire change despite the new track's abrasive surface. Everett, in fact, overestimated possible tire wear, and this, combined with a shove from a Camaro into Kwech's Alfa and a subsequent mechanical black flag, very likely cost him a win in the small-bore category. Donohue, too, went with only one change of tires, but he had the wrong gear in his car and couldn't pull more than 6000 rpm. Allem Moffat, newly bolted into the seat of a private Cougar, out-qualified all of the works Cougars for fourth on the grid. He bundled his car into a hay bale on the eighth lap and quit with a bent front end.

In the under two liter category, Monte Winkler won in an Alfa Romeo followed by Bert Everett in a Porsche.

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

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ONG-RUMORED COMPACT I

New truck expected to join line-up for 2022 model year.

All those rumors and spy shots, it seems, have been on the money, Ford today confirming it will launch a new, compact pickup that will revive the name "Maverick."

Set to make its formal debut next week, the new truck will slot into the line-up below the current Ford Ranger and target an emerging segment that could provide an option for young budget-minded buyers. It will take a non-traditional approach to the unveiling fitting for the audience Maverick is targeting.

"The all-new Ford Maverick makes its debut on June 8 with the help of actress Gabrielle Union," Ford said in a statement released today. "She will show off the all-new truck on her own Instagram and TikTok channels, on Ford's social channels as well as on Hulu. The Maverick will be Ford's first vehicle to debut on its new U.S. TikTok channel."



Actress Gabrielle Union will be touting Ford's new small pickup truck, the Maverick.

The move to use Union, who's starred in a variety of movies and television series, mirrors Hyundai's marketing efforts on its new Santa Cruz small pickup, aiming to attract younger, urban buyers to the vehicle and brand.

Bringing back a once-iconic badge

Ford first used the name, Maverick, for a compact twodoor coupe launched in the 1970 model year, adding a fourdoor version later. It was one amongst a stable of so-called pony cars that included the smaller — and ill-fated — Pinto. Today, only the familiar Mustang nameplate survives, Maverick being discontinued in the U.S. in 1977, and in other markets two years later.

But rumors have been circulating for more than a year that Ford might bring the badge back and stamp it on the new, compact pickup that company officials had already confirmed in 2019 that they were working on. In July 2020, in fact, an image of a Ford tailgate bearing the Maverick name was leaked out




Ford is the dominant U.S. player in the pickup mar-

ket, the full-size F-Series line spending nearly four decades as the best-selling nameplate in the market. The midsize Ranger has gained traction since it was revived for the 2019 model year.

Then a couple years back we had a new member join our Charter Oak Model A Club of Visalia, CA. His name is Tim McMaster of Visalia. Tim is a Bonneville racer also. He's also a "Salt Guy"......Tim has set some records of his own in his flathead "Y Block" powered Ford Roadster. Pretty

I just keep getting these opportunities to kind of "cozy to these speed guys.

Then, just recently my wife Linda and I took a little vacation to Ventura, Ca via the Highway 33 route. Now if you've ever been on Highway 33 to Ventura it's quite an experience. We were kind of scoping it out for a Model A Club tour. It will be a good one.

But.....getting back to the vacation story, I called a new friend of mine...... that I had never met in person, except for a lot of emails back and forth and really felt that I knew Steve Serr (of Miller Hi- Speed Head fame). So I had called Steve and made arrangements to visit his base of operations for building his famous and legendary Model A overhead valve adaptation, while we were visiting cool and

sunny Ventura, CA.

Steve Serr is a very unassuming person but an intelligently superb developer of the "Miller Hi-Speed Head".

Steve's Shop is in his two-car garage at 773 Utica St, east of Ventura. Steve was born and raised in this quaint little town and loves where he lives.

As we approached Steve's shop/home he met us and led us into his home to start our talk and find out what he had in store for us. We had told him "we would like to see your operation". He had mentioned that not all of his operation was done at his home/shop but was scattered in three locations in Ventura.

He sat us down and gave us the rundown on his love, "The Miller Hi-Speed Head". We then went out to his garage/shop to see how he prepares the casting that comes from Tom Roberts Designs

Next, Steve wanted to share with us his friend Tom Roberts shop and refuge where Tom creates his masterpiece head castings. Tom's shop is located in the industrial area of south

Steve is a very outgoing "speed guy" and so his whole explanation on combustion chamber design and intake manifolds was so interesting to me as a novice mechanic. I had loads of questions for Steve and on the way to Tom's shop I fired them at him.

In 1998, Steve Serr, founder and owner of Miller Hi-Speed Head Co., orchestrated the development of new foundry patterns made from copies of the original two-port cylinder head drawings by Leo Goossen dated 1928. Steve's goal was to cast an A-356 aluminum alloy, heat-treated (to T-6 specifications) version of the square-shoulder Miller-Schofield-Crager overhead valve (OHV) conversion cylinder head for 1928-1934 Ford four cylinder engines. The result of over a decade of hard work is what you see here today and the results speak for themselves!"

Tom Roberts is very well known in the racing circles in Southern California. He was originally trained at Northrup Aviation Institute as an A&E aviation mechanic, although didn't spend much time with the airplane industry but was more interested in all of his classmates and instructors love for "Hot Rods". Of course Tom was in on the ground floor of the hot rod craze and so was brought up on flatheads, gas, oil and exhaust fumes.

Getting to know Tom was quite an experience for my wife Linda and I. Tom is one of those magnificent artists when it comes to mold design.

"About Tom Roberts designs: Tom Roberts' skills go far beyond the demands of building hardware for the Flathead Ford. His engine heads, blocks and gear-boxes have been instrumental to the world's most successful Indy cars, dragsters, off-shore racing boats and even some experimental aircraft."

THE WINNING EDGE #42

Hi everyone, I'm not sure about you, but this summer weather is very enjoyable although the heat hurts a little more as $\rm I \,\,$ get older.

My last article was primarily about intake valves so I would like to continue in that direction while on the subject.

First I would like to discuss the installation of larger valves. Generally, increasing the valve head diameter will increase flow, but there are many other variables that need to be taken into consideration. A bigger valve in it self doesn't increase flow. A larger valve allows the throat of the seat to be opened up increasing air flow if this was the limited area to start with.


Another situation to consider when going to a larger valve is shrouding. Depending on the way the combustion chamber is designed you could actually lose flow going to a larger valve. In some instances you can open up the chamber to help the valve shrouding, but then compression ratio needs to be brought into the equation.

You also need to consider the angle at which the runner leads into the chamber. If the air is directed more toward the center of the chamber away from the shrouded area you may only lose a small amount of the flow at low lift if you lose any at all.

Before ending this article I would like to add a couple things about titanium valves which was briefly discussed in my last article. The rush to smaller stem diameters has basically leveled off. Hollow stem valves are growing more popular, both in stainless and titanium. Titanium is receiving most of the attention. As engine rpm's are pushed higher & higher, valve train weight gets more and more important. There is also a significant increase in sodium filled exhaust valves. The availability of hollow head titanium valves, I believe, is right around the corner. The available finishing and coatings for these valves seems endless.


Valley Racing History - Crow's Landing

The Ford team of Titus and Bucknum ended up winning the championship while Porsche won the under two liter category. Drivers' championships were not awarded in Trans-Am until 1972.


This was the only race held at the Crow's Landing Airport. Today SCCA holds some autocross events there at what

is now called "The Crows Landing Air Facility". Bordered by Fink Road to the south and Marshall Road to the north, it stands west of Highway 33 between Patterson and Crows Landing. The county has enlisted a developer to turn the acreage into an industrial park that would serve as a rail hub for the Port of Oakland and would include a solar farm. The area now requires a toxic waste cleanup, one of the reasons



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FORD CONFIRMS MAVERICK....



When many people think of a Ford Maverick, something like this comes to mind.

Targeting a new segment and a new buyer

With Maverick, the automaker will target young, entry-level buyers looking for something both versatile and affordable. Some industry analysts see a broad opportunity to grow a segment that has largely been ignored in recent decades. There are new signs of life, however, Hyundai earlier this year unveiling its own entry, the new Santa Cruz.

Unlike traditional, body-on-frame pickups, however, both Santa Cruz and Maverick will be unibody designs. The new Ford offering is believed to be based on the same platform as the Escape SUV.

Several Mavericks have been spied on public roads undergoing testing in recent months. They've been seen with different grille layouts, one with hexagonal openings, another with small rectangles. The differences are believed to represent separate versions of the compact pickup – much as Ford uses different grilles and lighting to distinguish various trim levels for the big F-150.

Several versions on tap

It is widely expected that the Maverick will be offered in both all-wheel-drive and front-wheel-drive. The AWD package may use an independent rear suspension, the FWD alternative getting a less expensive twist beam setup.

The Ford Maverick also is expected to share powertrains with the Escape, offering future buyers options including a base, turbocharged three-cylinder package making 180 horsepower and 177 pound-feet of torque. The upgrade would be a turbocharged Ecoboost four-cylinder engine displacing 2.0 liters and making 250 hp and 275 lb-ft.

There have also been some reports suggesting Maverick might get a hybrid option. The challenge will be holding down pricing so as not to push into the same territory as the current Ranger line.

Ford is expected to reveal more details on June 8, but we expect Maverick to go on sale late this year as a 2022 model. It will be produced at the same Hermosillo, Mexico plant now producing the Bronco Sport. That line also is based on the Escape platform, albeit one heavily modified for off-road

adventuring.

Considering Ranger currently starts around \$25,000, the 2022 Ford Maverick is expected to come in closer to the \$20,000 mark in front-wheel-drive form.

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

"Now......I know what Speed Demon is" and where the Southern, CA. gathering point is for a lot of the well known race guys.





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
