Rare Toyota Now On Display at Woodland Jaguar XKE and Porsche 911 and sales were dismal.

If you haven't been to the Woodland Auto Display, adjacent to the Estrella Warbirds Museum in Paso Robles, you're missing out on a great experience. Over a hundred classics, exotics and racecars plus the research library and Western Stock Car / Motorsports Hall of Fame will keep you busy for hours

And not to be missed, now on loan from a local enthusiast Dan Egan of nearby Arroyo Grande, is an ultra rare 1967 Toyota 2000 GT. This rare Toyota, owned by Egan since 1974, was designed by Toyota compete with Porsche and burnish their quality and performance image. Only 337 of these were built by Yamaha for Toyota from 1967 to 1970 and only 60 were left hand drive. Very few made it to the U.S. Toyota wasn't the name it is today, you had to be under 5'8" or so to fit in it and the car cost twice that of a Corvette, more than a

The 2000GT, powered by a two liter, triple carbureted 150 horsepower inline six, was raced by the factory in Japan, and in a long and convoluted story, Carroll Shelby was hired to race a couple here. They looked competitive in testing to Porsches, so said driver Davey Jordan, but SCCA changed the rules, allowed Porsche more options, and the Toyota's did not win verv much.




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Aero Testing A GT350

A few years ago I tested the "new" GT350R Mustang at Willow Springs Raceway. You might have read the aricle here



In 2018, some Shelby veterans from the old days, Jim Marietta and Ted Sutton, calling themselves the "Original Venice Crew" after the original Shelby workshops in Venice, CA, got together and decided to build some continuation GT350s. More recently, the Shelby guys wanted to do some aerodynamic testing, never done back in 1965. So they fitted out a car with a redesigned hood, something that Pete Brock wanted to try back in 1965 and added a thousand tufts of wool, the better to see where the air was going.

Then, after a hundred laps at well over 100 miles an hour, filmed by go pro cameras in the car and a number of them spaced around the track, it was time to evaluate the results. Bottom line, the air flow into the motor was better and the engine ran cooler.

Altogether a successful old school style test, most of todays racecars are tested in wind tunnels

And if you want to buy one (note they're about \$250K, half the price of an authentic original), go to Shelby's SoCal facility in Gardena, CA, just off the 405 right across from where the Goodyear Blimp takes off and lands. For more information, visit www.ovcmustangs.com

And about Willow Springs, the track is two and a half miles long and is the fastest road course in the country. There are a few places where you're under 100 mph with some challenging high-speed corners and no room for error. Get out there for a track day and if you need a driver call me.

Chevrolet and Ford have designed many iconic models – yet none are more iconic than a segment the two still compete in to this day, the pony car, featuring the Chevrolet Camaro and Ford Mustang.

Ford was first out of the gate with their launch of the Mustang in April 1964, halfway through the 1964 model year – and although all Mustangs sold in 1964 were technically "1964¹/₂" models, they were titled 1965 models. It was small, nimble – and extremely popular – defining the "pony car" segment with phenomenal success. General Motors had to act, and act fast, to maintain market relevance.

Within months Chevrolet began work on "Project Panther", their secret platform to compete against the Mustang. Some say the name "Camaro" had French roots, others claim it had Spanish origins – either way, it's a nameplate that's inspired performance enthusiast for decades! Launched in September 1966 for the 1967 model year, the new Chevrolet Camaro shared many components with the Pontiac Firebird – all part of General Motors strategy to attack the Mustang from multiple angles and dominate the emerging pony car market!

Part of what distinguished the unique pony car segment was coupe and convertible body options, plus multiple powertrain configurations ranging from inline 6s to big V8s & a multitude of available trim and feature options. The Camaro itself offered approximately 80 factory choices and 40 dealer upgrades!

In fact, these options all play a significant part in determining each Camaro's value in today's classic car market. The most exclusive of 1967 models was the secretive Z/28 with only 602 built and ordered through Chevy's RPO system by those who knew this race-oriented package existed! The SS performance package featured three V8 engine options, and represents 34,411 of the 1967 models. The RS appearance package, available on its own or combined with SS or Z/28 packages, accounted for 64,842 cars produced in 1967. The most common model in 1967 was the base Camaro, with 121,051 produced.

The beautiful 1967 Camaro RS you see here is a true RS in iconic butternut yellow, with the RS appearance trim package featuring vinyl top, blackout grill with hidden headlights, revised parking lights, tail lights, and reverse lights, upgraded interior trim, front wrap-around stripe, and RS badging. It has a '60s 'street-racer' stance, and wears American Racing wheels with aggressive 275/60/15 rear tires & 215/60/15 fronts. The keen eye will notice the LS1 front quarter badges, and those highlight this as a full custom build. Under hood is a 5.7L LS1 conversion complete with power steering and air conditioning! That LS1 power gets to the ground through a Tremec 5-speed manual transmission with hydraulic clutch that spins a limited-slip 12-bolt rear end loaded with 4:10 gears!! Slotted disc brakes front & rear bring it to a quick and safe stop. Tubular A-arms, larger sway bars front & rear, and BMR sub-frame connectors keep it planted to the road!! The classic RS interior has been upgraded with Auto Meter gauges, and a classic-style audio system that looks period correct, but is filled with all the currenttech features!!

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CALIFORNIA LEGALIZES **AUTOMOBILE** CRUISING

Success in California! Governor Gavin Newsom signed SAN-supported legislation (AB 436) into law to allow automobile cruising activities to return statewide. Previously, local authorities were authorized to pass ordinances that regulate or prohibit cruising. Authored by Assembly Member David Alvarez (D-San Diego), this effort

follows a resolution approved by the legislature last year to celebrate the history and culture of automobile cruising and encourage local officials and law enforcement to work with local car clubs to conduct safe cruising events. The new law will go into effect January 1, 2024.
